



Important Message from the Principal - Coronavirus

Rise to the Challenge

Dear Sydney School of English Community,

Following the latest information and guidelines provided by NSW Health on the outbreak of Novel Coronavirus, I ask that if your family visited China during the school holidays, you refrain from sending your child to the Sydney School of English (SSE) until:

1. an incubation period of fourteen (14) days has passed; and,
2. you have received medical clearance after the incubation period to state that your child is fit to attend class.

Furthermore, I ask that if your child is unwell, has a fever or develops flu-like symptoms, even if your family has not travelled to China during the school holidays, you keep your child at home until all symptoms have cleared. Any student displaying symptoms of respiratory infections will be asked to leave class immediately and to wear a face mask until collected by a parent or guardian.

Although classes will commence as scheduled this Saturday, the 1st of February, I ask that the above precautions are adhered to in conjunction with good basic hygiene such as the thorough washing and drying of hands after going to the toilet and, before and after eating. In addition, although hand sanitisers will be readily available in all classrooms, toilets and at reception, students are encouraged to bring their own.

However, it is also important to remain calm during this time and to remember that the safety of students and staff is a priority of the entire SSE community and, to this end, I thank you for your support, understanding and cooperation regarding this situation.
